

Dear Members:

It was so nice to see so many of you at the July General Meeting, our first in-person meeting in 15 months. It allowed us to reconnect with club members many of us have not seen in a long time.

Activities at the club are in full swing! The Juniors have held two successful play days and will be sponsoring a 3rd this month, on Saturday, the 28th. The event is open to all senior members, and I would encourage you to sign up and have some fun with your equines and support our Junior organization.

Our cattle program is going strong with team penning on Saturday evenings and ranch cutting on Thursday evenings. Both programs offer an excellent opportunity for members to expose their horses to cattle. No prior experience is required. Come on down and work on enhancing your horsemanship skills. Our cattle program is a wonderful social event.

Tamalpais Trail Riders (TTR) will be sponsoring its 80th Annual Trail Test on September 19 at 9:00 a.m. at the club. The event is open to the public and will include 10 obstacles, and cash prizes and ribbons to senior and junior winners. This trail test is a chance to test rider and horse. Entry fee is only \$40.

Our club will be sponsoring an overnight ride at Five Brooks Horse Camp (formerly Stewart Camp) on Sept 25-26. Save the date!! If you would like to ride, camp and eat, you should reserve a spot. We have limited space reserved for those wanting to come out early on Sept 24 and for Sept 25. The rides will begin at 10 a.m. on Sept 25 following a short breakfast. All participating members will be responsible for paying the Five Brook Fees of \$10 per rig, \$10 per person and \$10 per horse per day. There will be an additional fee to cover dinner and breakfast. Stay tuned for more details in the September newsletter and via email. The campgrounds have facilities like hot showers and toilets, so participants will not be roughing it completely. This will be a wonderful family experience since this event is open to our Junior members as long as a member parent or member guardian accompanies the Junior. Note that this is a members-only event, and since space will be limited, we ask that you make a reservation to ensure a spot. Feel free to email me. We will offer long, medium and short rides led by experienced trail bosses. Saddle up and come on out.

Membership Update

Welcome Susan Rolovich!

Susan was approved by the membership at the July 6 General Meeting. Her sponsor is Jeff Roth.

Recently retired from the San Francisco Police Department after 38 years of service, Susan worked patrol at the SFPD's Park, Northern and Southern Stations. She also served as a school resource officer, a defensive tactics officer and an instructor at the police academy, as well as a juvenile inspector. Most of her career was spent as an undercover narcotics officer and a vice decoy officer, but her long-time wish and passion were to become a mounted police officer.

Susan was born and raised in San Francisco. As a single parent of four children (three boys and one girl), she was only able to dream of becoming a mounted police officer due to all the demands on her time. After waiting 28 years to get into the mounted unit but never having been on a horse, she trained and trained and trained (including with Jeff Roth), and eventually became a post certified instructor for the California Mounted Officers, the San Francisco Mounted Officers and the Santa Monica Mounted Officers. Instead of retiring after 30 years, she stayed an extra eight years and adopted her mount, Dewey, who now boards in Novato at the ranch of Leah and Dave Kranci, friends of Susan's. Of her new NHI membership, Susan says "I'd love to lead rides and volunteer in other ways. So I appreciate this membership, and I can help in many ways."

Like their mom, Susan's children have pursued careers in public service. Her oldest son is a battalion chief in the SFFD, and her second son is a sergeant in the SFPD. Her daughter is a nurse at UCSF, and her youngest son is a firefighter in the SFFD. She currently has three grandchildren (one boy and two girls) and a fourth grandbaby on the way. "I'd love to teach them and other youth about horsemanship since it is a big part of my world now," she says.

Arena and Club Grounds

Please remember to clean up after your equines! It's not enough to scoop the poop you may be leaving in the arena and on the grounds, but please be sure to empty any poop cart you use if you see that it's filling up. There's a manure pile near the caretaker's house, shown in the picture to the right. Picking up manure and depositing it in a designated pile goes a long way toward helping with fly control – always an issue at this time of year and throughout the next couple of months.

Also, please deposit only poop in the carts and in the manure pile. These aren't the right places for tissues or other refuse. There are garbage cans on site for non-manure items that you may wish to throw away. Thank you! We appreciate your participation and contributions very much in keeping our grounds clean.
