Reese Knowlton Gives Juniors a Driving Demo

NHI Juniors moved their Tuesday, Nov 9, meeting to Thursday, Nov. 11, so they could have a special driving demo with Reese Knowlton and her minis, Cowboy and Ace. While both minis are trained for team-driving, Reese brought her single horse cart for convenience. Reese demonstrated how to start a horse by getting him used to the tack on his body and the feeling of a bit in his mouth. She talked about the benefit of ground-driving to get started, and getting the horse accustomed to dragging an object behind him like a rubber mat or tire. She identified each piece of tack used for driving and its purpose. Reese also emphasized the importance of teaching miniature horses a useful skill, enabling them to be more than a "pasture pet" and thus giving them more value. If they have training in show or driving, people are more likely to better care for them and not allow them to get sold from home to home. She answered a few questions, like how much weight can they can pull? (Answer: three to four times their weight, if conditioned.) Once she got Cowboy hitched to the cart, she gave Juniors the opportunity to ride with her around the parking lot. Since she didn't have the team cart, she tied Ace to the cart so he could walk with his buddy. Cowboy.

Our season is typically May-October, but varies a bit year to year. I currently have two Argentine polo ponies, one Appaloosa, and one Thoroughbred/Criollo mix from California. In all this, I love partnering with my horses as we play!"
